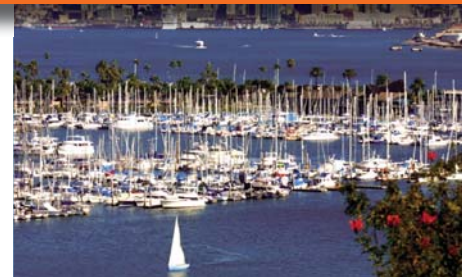

About This Meeting

Topics for this meeting were selected by various methods. Suggestions for topics were derived from evaluations of the 2009 and other previous Annual and Mid Year Meetings, the Annual and Mid-Year Meeting Committees and Board members, reviews of the published literature with the highest impact on the specialty, and by soliciting suggestions from members of SAMBA active in the clinical practice of ambulatory anesthesia.

These suggestions were discussed by our authorities in the field of ambulatory anesthesia with educators who attended previous annual, mid-year and board meetings.

The purpose of this Mid-Year meeting is to educate and share information that will enable anesthesiology practitioners to provide the highest level of ambulatory anesthesia services and improve patient outcomes.
